Donald McKayle: Dancing for All Time

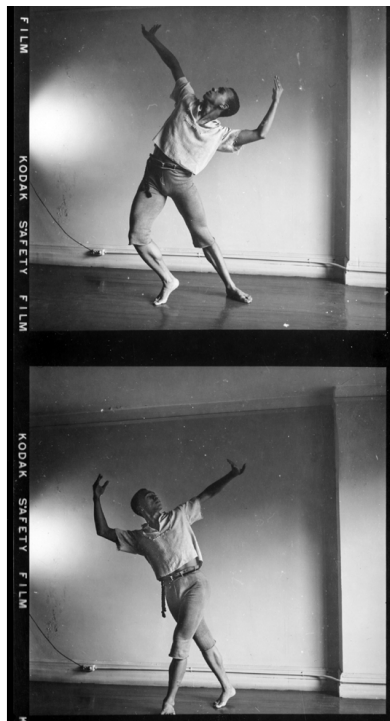
